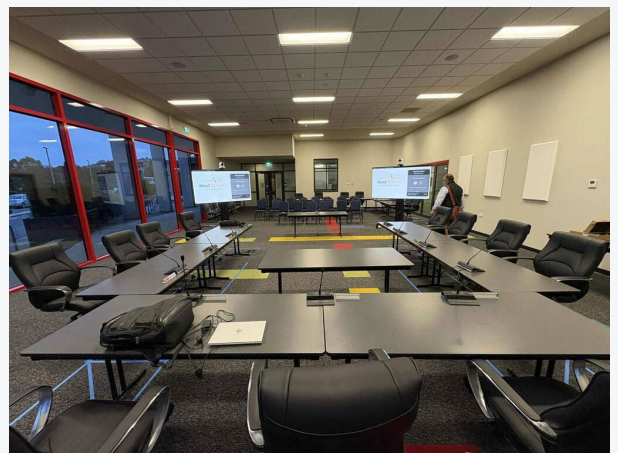

## LEGANA PLAN CONSULTATION

West Tamar Council is inviting the community to have their say on the Draft Legana Town Centre & Township Structure Plan, a long-term strategic framework that will guide how Legana grows and evolves over the next 20 years.

Legana is one of Tasmania's fastest-growing areas, with forecasts showing the West Tamar region will welcome more than 7000 new residents by 2045, many of whom are expected to settle in Legana. To meet this demand, the updated Structure Plan sets out a clear vision for sustainable development, improved infrastructure, and enhanced community facilities.



Community consultation is now open and runs through to Monday, January 26, 2026.

## DECEMBER 2025 COUNCIL MEETING

### At its December ordinary meeting, Council:

- Approved Planning Application PA2025084 for Multiple Dwellings (x4) at 7-9 Summit Road, Trevallyn.

- Considered an AGM motion from P. Kearney and endorsed an alternative recommendation for the naming of the lecturn at the Windsor Council Chambers as the "Geoff Dickinson Memorial Lectern".
- Considered an AGM motion from P. Kearney and endorsed an amended motion for Council to develop a housing plan in line with the actions detailed in the West Tamar Growth Strategy.
- Considered an AGM motion from J. Walker and endorsed an amended motion for Council to continue to monitor, along with TasWater, the inflow and infiltration of stormwater into the Legana Sewerage Treatment Plant lagoons in the 2026/27 financial year.

- Received the West Tamar Council Audit Panel Confirmed Minutes for August and Unconfirmed Minutes for December.
- Received and endorsed the West Tamar Growth Strategy and Infrastructure Plan.

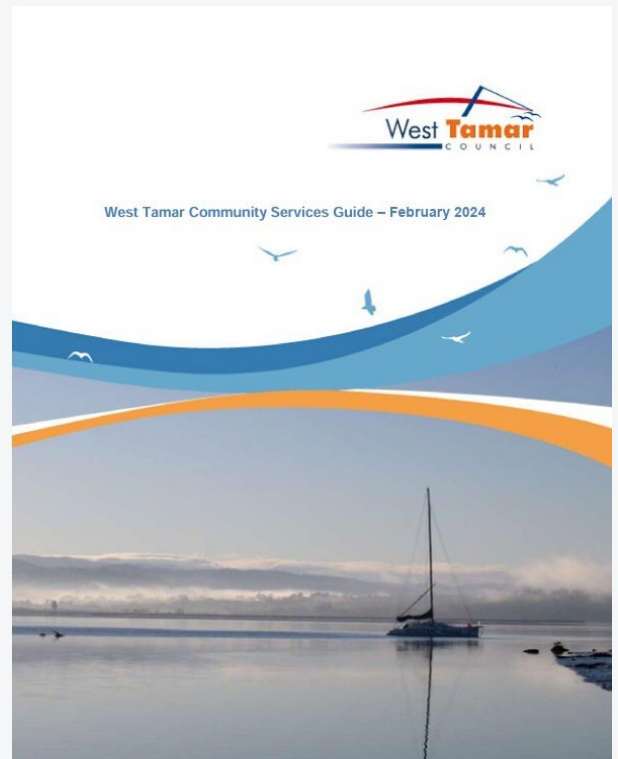


## HELP FINDING THE RIGHT SUPPORT

West Tamar Council's Community Support Resource is a practical guide designed to help residents find the right support quickly and locally where possible. It brings together key services in one place so people know where to turn in times of need.

The Community Support Resource is a compiled information booklet created to assist community members experiencing hardship or needing extra support. It sits alongside Council's broader Community Service Guide and is promoted as a central point to access local and statewide services.

This document is aimed at all West Tamar residents, including individuals, families, older people, and young people who may be facing financial, social, or wellbeing challenges. It is also a useful tool for local service providers, volunteers, and community groups who want to refer people to reliable support options.





The resource brings together contacts for services such as emergency relief, housing and homelessness support, mental health and counselling, family and youth support, and financial assistance. It is designed to make it easier to navigate what can otherwise be a confusing system of agencies and programs.
